



How Tartar and Plaque Buildup Over Time




BACTERIA ACCUMULATES

Your pet's mouth
naturally plays host to a
large number of
bacteria - some good
and some bad. Left
unchecked the bad
bacteria accumulate
and multiply, setting the
stage for the formation
of biofilm.




BIOFILM FORMS

In as little as 6-8 hours after cleaning, bacteria organize to form biofilm that covers the teeth and gum surfaces. This biofilm continues to grow and thicken over time.



DENTAL PLAQUE APPEARS

As the biofilm thickens, it turns into dental plaque with is an indication of significant accumulation of bacteria on the teeth and gums. Over time, dental plaque becomes laden with minerals.



TARTAR INVADES

As the accumulated minerals in the dental plaque harden, they form a solid yellow-brown buildup know as tartar. Left untreated, this leads to the development of gingivitis and the beginning stages of periodontal disease.
